George Washington Clark with son Francis Atwood Clark. George Washington Clark was born June 10 1846 in Hyde Park, VT, which was before the Civil War. His first wife and son died early and his marriage to Blanche June 1 1905 was his second marriage. G W was an exceptionally successful business man, a civic leader, and a philanthropist.

It was an all day train trip.

Francis in 1934, probably.




An unusual color picture of Francine on left and Harold Clark.

May and Brush with ???. Horses were a favored Garfield activity during these years.





This is summer 1994 and is May, Brush and myself in front of the fireplace at the Clark camp in Garfield,VT. The stone fireplace was put in by Brush and Jean and I forget the name of the mason who did the work sometime in the late 1940s. The rocks were collected by Brush and Jean and the fireplace was constructed with a Heatolator steel insert and the ducts you see at the top of the picture. It worked very well, and is still in use today.



These two pictures taken at the Clark home in 1999 are somewhat of a production instead of a regular snapshot. I had come into the house to take a picture of Brush and found him looking out the window. I said, "Just hold right there a minute, Brush" and took this pensive picture. I then went out to the flower shop and posed Jean in a similar pose to make the pair of pictures.



This is one of my last trips with Brush. We went up camp road to check out Murray's headstone. It was not in place when we were there, but was in place the next day for Murray's service.
